PURPOSE

To explain to our school community the Department's and Glenroy Specialist School's policy requirements and expectations relating to students using mobile phones, wearable devices and other personal mobile devices during school hours.

SCOPE

This policy applies to:

- 1. All students at Glenroy Specialist School and,
- 2. Students' personal mobile phones, wearable devices and other personal mobile devices brought onto school premises during school hours, including recess and lunchtime.

DEFINITIONS

A mobile phone is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network.

A wearable device is an electronic device designed to be worn as an accessory, including smartwatches, with or without a physical connection to a network.

POLICY

Glenroy Specialist School understands that students may bring a personal mobile phone, wearable device or personal mobile device to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school.

At Glenroy Specialist School:

- Students who choose to bring mobile phones and wearable devices to school must have them switched off and securely stored during school hours.
- Exceptions to this policy may be applied if certain conditions are met (see below for further information).
- Devices with remote monitoring capabilities, that can record surroundings and take photos from a mobile app, are not allowed onsite.
- When emergencies occur, parents or carers should reach their child by calling the school's office.

Personal mobile phone use

In accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy</u> issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at Glenroy Specialist School during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

Secure storage

Mobile phones and wearable devices owned by students at Glenroy Specialist School are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone or wearable device to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Glenroy Specialist School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items. Refer to the Glenroy Specialist School's Personal Property Policy AND/OR the Department's <u>Claims for Property Damage and Medical Expenses policy.</u>]

Where students bring a mobile phone or wearable device to school, Glenroy Specialist School will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At Glenroy Specialist School students are required to store their phones in lockable cupboards provided on site.

Enforcement

Students who use their personal mobile phones or wearable devices inappropriately at Glenroy Specialist School may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing <u>Student</u> <u>Wellbeing and Engagement</u> and <u>Bullying</u> policies.

At Glenroy Specialist School inappropriate use of mobile phones or wearable devices is **any use during school hours**, unless an exception has been granted, and particularly use of a mobile phone or wearable device:

- in any way that disrupts the learning of others
- to send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls
- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying
- to capture video or images of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission
- to record audio of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission
- to capture video or images in the school toilets, changing rooms, swimming pools and gyms
- during exams and assessments

Exceptions

Exceptions to the policy:

- may be applied during school hours if certain conditions are met, specifically,
 - Health and wellbeing-related exceptions; and
 - Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite.

• can be granted by the Principal, or by the teacher for that class, in accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy</u>.

The three categories of exceptions allowed under the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use</u> <u>Policy</u> are:

1. Learning-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation
For specific learning activities (class-based exception)	Unit of work, learning sequence
For students for whom a reasonable adjustment to a learning program is needed because of a disability or learning difficulty	Individual Learning Plan, Individual Education Plan

2. Health and wellbeing-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation
Students with a health condition	Student Health Support Plan
Students who are Young Carers	A localised student record

3. Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite

Specific exception	Documentation
Travelling to and from excursions	Risk assessment planning documentation
Students on excursions and camps	Risk assessment planning documentation
When students are offsite (not on school grounds) and unsupervised with parental permission	Risk assessment planning documentation
Students with a dual enrolment or who need to undertake intercampus travel	Risk assessment planning documentation

Where an exception is granted, the student can only use the mobile phone for the purpose for which it was granted.

Camps, excursions and extracurricular activities

Glenroy Specialist School will provide students and their parents and carers with information about items that can or cannot be brought to camps, excursions, special activities and events, including personal mobile phones.

Exclusions

This policy does not apply to

- Out-of-school-hours events
- Travelling to and from school
- Students undertaking workplace learning activities, e.g. work experience

• Students who are undertaking VET
